




Interesting Childhood Memory

On Wednesday, Ben finally recovered from the fever. He still had a bit of sore throat but he could talk. And now, he is as good as new.




The Lost Money

I have quite a lot of expectations in Primary 5 so I choose a few of them to write about.



A Famous Person

Good morning everyone. Today I am going to share with you something about Roald Dahl. He wrote many children's novel, for example, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, Matilda, Fantastic Mr. Fox, James and the Giant Peach, etc.

Do you like Charlie and the Chocolate Factory? In 1929, Roald Dahl's mother sent him to a boarding school which was called Repton. Pupils in Repton were invited to try chocolate bars, for chocolate were very expensive at that time. A memory of that visit stayed with Roald Dahl throughout his life, inspiring him to write Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Nowadays, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory have been translated into 59 languages and have been sold for more than 200 million copies.


Roald Dahl's father died when Roald Dahl was three. He was raised by his Norwegian mother, who took him to Norway for annual trips. She told him the stories of trolls and witches presented in the dark Scandinavian fables. Roald Dahl was influenced by those stories, and he turned his experiences into the themes of his children's books.

Do you know what did Roald Dahl do before he became a well-known author? Roald Dahl worked for an oil company in East Africa before he became an author. He was also a pilot in the Royal Air Force and took part in the Second World War. However, in September 1940, he crashed in the Libyan Desert, and the severe injuries left him unfit to fly.
